
Our KS4 English Curriculum



Creative Prose Writing

 Creative writing is a fundamental element
of Language Paper 1. We will establish the basics of prose writing and story structures.

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The Spoken Language Endorsement is the third component of your English Language GCSE. You are required to present, on a subject of your choice, to an audience.
