

Dear parent / carer,

I'm pleased to let you know that The High School offers the Bronze Duke of Edinburgh's Award (DofE) to students in Year 9.

The DofE is a great chance for your child to broaden their horizons, discover new interests and talents, have fun with friends, develop essential skills for their future and achieve an internationally renowned Award.

As DofE Manager, I wanted to send you some information about what a DofE programme involves, the benefits for your child and how they can sign up.

About the DofE

The DofE is non-competitive and open to all young people – it's about setting personal challenges and pushing personal boundaries. There are three levels of DofE programme which, when successfully completed, lead to a Bronze, Silver or Gold Award.

Through their DofE, students will make friends and memories and build traits like confidence, resilience and self-esteem, which can benefit mental health. They'll gain skills and attributes for work and life, like problem-solving, team-working and self-motivation – and they'll achieve an Award that's recognised by top employers and can help them stand out when applying for university or jobs.

To achieve their Bronze Award, participants must complete four sections: Skills, Volunteering, Physical and their Expedition

Every young person's DofE programme is personal to them – they can choose what they'd like to do for their Skills, Volunteering and Physical sections, and most activities can count. We will provide guidance and support, and students can either choose to continue an activity they already do or discover something completely new.

Activities for each section **must** take a **minimum** of one hour a week over a set period of time, so they can fit around studying, hobbies and social lives. For more details about programmes and timescales

About the expedition

The Expedition section involves your child working as part of a small team to plan their expedition's aim, choose a location and do some training, and plan a route to make sure they are fully prepared. This is usually completed locally.

The motivation and focus the DofE gives, and its positive impact on mental and physical health, can play an important role in helping your child navigate their expanding world and giving them skills and experiences to open doors in the future.

As participants can choose and change their activities, they can pick ones that they can do while social distancing or from home, and your DofE coordinator also has ideas for sections.

eDofE and the DofE app

Participants can create their DofE programme and record their progress using eDofE, the DofE's digital system, available online at eDofE.org and through the DofE app – downloadable for free from Google Play and the App Store.

Signing up

The total cost including expedition costs including kit loan, travel, training, gas, campsites and assessment for Bronze DofE is £145 participant which can be made in instalments

The first instalment of £50 includes your child's participation place and Welcome Pack, which will be sent to their home address and includes their personalised DofE Discount Card. This is followed by 2 further instalments of £45 and £50

Once the form has been received, DofE will be added to Parentpay where payment can be made online in instalments. If you require your parentpay log in details, please request this and we can arrange this for you.

Once the first payment is made, we will set up their eDofE account and they will receive details of how to sign in and get started. We will also hold an eDofE launch session online to help

If the cost of taking part is prohibitive, please speak to your school as there may be financial support available to you.
